Abstract: Emerson's Representative Men essay on Montaigne makes clear how deeply indebted to Montaigne he is. But what did Emerson find there and how did it shape his thought (and Transcendentalism)?

He is the author of The Concept 'Horse' Paradox and Wittgensteinian Conceptual Investigations, and editor of (and contributor to) Ludwig Wittgenstein: Key Concepts. He has published numerous essays on judgment, philosophical psychology, metaphilosophy, the philosophy of religion, and the history of philosophy; as well as a book of poetry, Stony Lonesome.
