Social Justice	A commitment to service with and for others.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Demonstrate a habit of service to the community of which they are a part. ○ Demonstrate knowledge of root causes of social justice issues. ○ Demonstrate empathy and compassion for those they serve. ○ Apply knowledge and experience to addressing issues of social justice, locally and globally. ○ Implement sustainable solutions to address social justice problems in the community. ○ Engage in principled dissent.

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
