Electives may be taken from a variety of areas, including: Corporate Communication (CCOM or CMST), Leadership (LEDR), Human Resources (HURE), Management (MANA), MBA, Public Service (PUBS), etc. Students have options to take classes in areas outside the Graduate School of Management pending pre-approval from the Graduate School of Management and the department of interest.

Specializations are not required. Students may utilize a maximum of 6 credits from the specialization groupings to double count toward both elective requirements and the specialization.

Pursing a specialization in Health Care Administration or Sports Leadership will lengthen a program by 9 credits. All requirements for the specialization must be completed prior to graduation from the Master in Leadership degree.

Earning a Certificate: Students can complete certificates in Leadership or Sports Leadership by completing the courses marked with * in the respective Leadership Required Core grouping or the Sports Leadership grouping. A maximum of six credits may double count between the certificate programs and the Master in Leadership degree.

Master in Leadership

Our goal at Marquette University and in the **Master in Leadership** program is to graduate students who are transformed by their education and who will transform the world in which they live—who will, in a phrase, become women and men for and with others.

Marquette's focus on the four core university values of excellence, faith, leadership and service challenges students to integrate knowledge, faith and real-life choices in ways that will shape their lives. Graduates will take these skills with them into the world and leadership organizations of all types and sizes.

Building Leaders. The program focuses on building what employers are looking for—strong communication and leadership skills, the creation and maintenance of collaborative and productive teams, conflict management and resolution, and the enactment and support of socially responsible behavior.

Flexible Schedule. Classes typically meet one evening per week. Some Leadership classes are offered in a blended format while others are offered 100 percent face-to-face. Courses are offered during the fall, spring and summer semesters so you have plenty of opportunities to advance your degree while staying on track with your career.

Application requirements for degree and certificate programs. Applicants must have completed a four-year undergraduate degree from an accredited college or university. In addition, Master in Leadership degree applicants must submit:

- Online application (including essay questions) and fee
- Official transcripts from each college or university attendee (other than Marquette University)
- GMAT, GRE or LSAT scores
 - Applicants may request a waiver of the GMAT/GRE exam requirement if they have earned an overall QPA of 3.25 or higher from an AACSB-accredited school or Department of Education approved Regional Accrediting Body.
- Resume
- Two letters of recommendation
- TOEFL, IELTS, PTE or other acceptable proof of English Proficiency scores (only for international applicants whose native language is not English)
