A grade of C or higher must be earned in each of a student's major courses, including the core courses introducing the major. Credit is never given twice for the same course, with the exception of different sections of variable topic courses.

Students can complete ECON 4986: Internship for Credit: Grading Period or ECON 4989: Internship for Credit: Work and Grading Period, but it will not count towards one of the ECON major electives.
