DISCOVERY TIER THEMES, ENGAGING SOCIAL SYSTEMS AND VALUES 2 (ESSV2) AND WRITING INTENSIVE COURSE REQUIREMENTS

DISCOVERY TIER THEMES AND COURSES

Students choose one theme that best connects to their personal and professional goals for their Discovery requirement. Students must complete four Discovery Tier courses, all from the SAME Discovery Theme. These four courses must include one course from each of the three content areas (Humanities, Natural Science and Mathematics and Social Science), and one elective (an additional course from any of the three content areas).

For students who participate in a full-time (12 credits or more) Marquette approved study abroad program, one study abroad course (minimum 2.5 transfer credits awarded) may fulfill the elective requirement of the Discovery Tier. Any additional MCC requirements may be fulfilled only when the approved transfer equivalent is an exact match to a specific MCC course.

For Students who began at Marquette University and the College of Business Administration in Fall 2019 and later: The university allows a maximum of two courses in the Discovery Tier Theme to apply towards a primary major. The College of Business Administration allows up to two courses in a student's declared Discovery Tier Theme to double count towards business core, major course work and/or upper division business electives. This can reduce the overall number of credits a student needs to graduate by a maximum of 6 credits.

DECLARING A DISCOVERY TIER THEME

Once a student has determined which theme may be the right fit, submit a [Declaration or Change of Marquette Core Curriculum Discovery Tier Theme form](#). This will allow the theme to appear on a graduation checklist. Students do not have to declare a theme in order to enroll in one of the courses. Students can change Discovery Tier Themes, but courses previously taken may not apply to the new selected theme.

THEMES

Reminder select a theme, declare a theme and take one Humanities, one Natural Science and Mathematics, one Social Science and one elective course from the same theme. Consider taking ESSV2 and WRIT requirements within the Discovery Tier coursework (definition and courses within ESSV2 and WRIT requirements listed later in this document).

Note: All prerequisites are listed, and course descriptions are linked. Anything highlighted in yellow is a business course and may be a good consideration.
