WHY?

THE CATHOLIC SOCIAL TRADITION The Synod of Bishops spoke about the relation between the Gospel and justice: "Action on behalf of justice and participation in the transformation of the world fully appear to us as a constitutive dimension of the preaching of the Gospel" (JW, Introduction). Thus, the church "fulfills her mission of preaching the Gospel" when it "teaches... the demands of justice" (CCC 2419). The very nature of the church gives rise to its social tradition. There have been various descriptions of this social justice tradition, especially since the publication of Pope Leo XIII's encyclical, Rerum novarum, in 1891. Common to these descriptions has been two important pillars of the tradition – the dignity of the human person and the common good.
