

PATIENT BILL OF RIGHTS

At Marquette University School of Dentistry, as a patient, you have the right to:

- Receive an explanation of recommended treatment, treatment alternatives, the option to refuse treatment, the risk of no treatment, expected outcomes of various treatments, and the estimated cost and approximate length of time necessary for continuity and completion of treatment prior to giving informed consent.
- Have access to complete and current information about your condition.
- Inspect your own dental record, which is confidential and may not be shared or transferred without your consent except as allowed under HIPAA Regulations.
- Discuss any concerns with your student, a faculty member or the Office of the Clinic Director. If you decide not to seek treatment, the consequences of non-treatment will be explained to you.
- Have access to available emergency dental care.
- Dental treatment that meets or exceeds the current standards of care in the dental profession.
- Receive treatment in an environment that adheres to OSHA, CDC and ADA recommendations and guidelines for infection control procedures. Standard Precautions are utilized to minimize the possibility of disease transmission and maintain the health and well-being of all patients and personnel.
