Dear Marquette Dual Enrollment students,

Thank you for your interest in the Explorer Dual Enrollment Program at Marquette University! Dual Enrollment courses may be new to you, and I would like to provide some additional information here to help you navigate and decide whether you would like to participate.

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

You will be registered as Non-Degree seeking student at Marquette to take dual enrollment courses. Non-Degree students must meet all academic regulations established by the university. For a complete list of Non-Degree Student Academic Regulations, refer to the Academic Regulations section of the <u>Undergraduate Bulletin</u>.

MARQUETTE CREDITS

Upon successful completion of Dual Enrollment courses, you will receive Marquette credits as well as high school credits. Because grades are linked, success at the dual enrollment courses affects both high school GPA (and credits toward graduation) as well as college GPA (which may or may not matter depending on your transfer plans), and Financial Aids eligibility.

CAMPUS RESOURCES

Dual Enrollment students have access to all Marquette's <u>campus resources</u> as any other Marquette student. Everyone at Marquette cares about the success of you as a dual enrollment student. We look forward to supporting you.

A few recourses that I would like to highlight for Dual Enrollment students:

Marquette credentials

You will receive the following credentials from Marquette University's Information Technology (ITS) Services:

- Marquette Email Address, which you need to login Marquette Email account.
- CheckMarq Username, which you need to login CheckMarq or D2L.

Access to campus buildings.

You can pick up a MUID card at Union Station on the first floor of AMU. With a MUID card, you have access to most of the campus buildings.

Access to various academic support programs:

- <u>Library</u>
- Academic coaching services.

Coaches provide students with semester-long academic support in areas such as

- The MIC Speakers Lab

At the MIC, you can receive help in all aspects of presentation development from brainstorming ideas and organizing content to practicing effective delivery and creating visuals.

- Writing Center

All writers--successful writers, anxious writers, prolific writers, struggling writers--benefit from talking about their writing in progress with an interested, experienced reader.

BENEFITS OF DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

- A taste of college coursework.
- Earn college credits; less time to finish college degree; save college tuition. Please note Marquette credits are widely accepted by most universities in the U.S. However, majority of Ivy League schools do NOT accept dual enrollment credits.
- A boost on college applications by demonstrating students' ability to balance both high school and college coursework.
- Access to the college library and resources.
- Explore fields of study that help students choose a major later.
