INSTRUCTIONS FOR UNDERGRADUATE CANDIDATES

ARRIVAL

- Doors open at 8 a.m. Graduates should arrive promptly to line up with college; processional will move to field at 8:45 a.m. in preparation for program.
- All graduates and guests will be subject to gate screening upon arrival. Please see [Brewers.com/security](https://brewers.com/security) for gate screening and security policies.
- Graduates remember to:
 - Wear your academic apparel. Undergraduates may retain or recycle their “Renew” cap and gown.
 - Bring your tickets. You and your guests need to each bring your own tickets, you will be using different entrances upon arrival.

PARKING

- Parking is complimentary – parking lots will be open at 7:30 a.m.
- Upon arrival, parking attendants will assist you in parking your vehicle.

ENTRANCES

- GRADUATES – enter at the Right Field Gate entrance, located at the southwest corner of the building. Once inside, you will immediately line up behind your college banner. You will join your guests after you cross the stage.
- GUESTS – enter at the Home Plate or Third Base Gate entrances. Once inside, guests will be directed to their assigned seats.
- Please see [American Family Field Student and Guest entrances](#) for entrance directions.

TICKETS

- The deadline has passed to reserve your tickets (deadline was April 16) through the mandatory RSVP for commencement.
- Graduates and guests will require a ticket to enter American Family Field.
- Tickets will be distributed at cap and gown pick up May 18-20 in the AMU Marquette Place for those who pre-registered for the Graduate Recognition Program.
- All guests 3 and older require a ticket for entry.
- Tickets will be scanned onsite.
- If you have not registered to pick up your cap and gown, please call University Special Events at 414-288-7431 immediately.
- For those who had their apparel shipped to their home, your tickets will be at the will call table, located outside of American Family Field in front of the Robin Yount statue, which is directly in front of the entrance to the Brewers Team Store

PROCESSIONAL

- Once inside, you will be directed to line up behind your college banner for the processional.
- A college representative will be stationed near your college banner. Upon arrival, check in with them to receive your pre-filled student name card. You will hand this card to the column marshal for the announcer to read your name as you cross the stage.
- You will be standing for long periods of time and walking on the warning track to the stage. You are strongly encouraged to wear comfortable footwear. High heels (including kitten and mid-sized heels) are not permitted on the track. Block or wedge heels are advisable.
- Processional lines will move from the staging area to the field by 8:45 a.m.
- Column Marshals and college representatives will be onsite to assist with lining up colleges.

GRADUATE RECOGNITION PROGRAM

- Processional lines will move from the staging area to the field by 8:45 a.m.
- The Recognition Program will begin promptly at 9 a.m. and will conclude no later than 11:30 a.m.
- As your college is being recognized, the Column Marshal will take your name card to be read by the announcer as you cross the stage
- You will receive your diploma cover and congratulations from your dean, Provost Ah Yun, and President Lovell.
- No handshaking, fist bumps or a wave are acceptable
- Photographer will take picture as you cross the stage.
- When you exit the stage, a Column Marshal will guide you to an American Family Field usher who will direct you to your seats where you will join your guests.
- When all colleges have been recognized, there will be a brief program.
- Following the program, you and your guests will exit following the American Family Field safety protocols.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Silly string, confetti, balloons, flowers are prohibited.
- Refer to the [Brewers.com/security](https://brewers.com/security) for a list of all other prohibited items.

ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT DETAILS

- No tailgating will be permitted before or after the ceremony.
- A limited amount of ADA seating is available. Seating will be assigned. Please contact University Special Events to reserve ADA seating.
- Guests 2 years and younger do not require a ticket, however they will need to sit on a parent or family member's lap.
- Carry-in food or snacks are not permitted; concessions will not be sold. Soda, water, or juice in factory-sealed plastic bottles are permitted (one per person, no larger than 32 ounces).
- All guests two years and older will be required to wear a face mask covering the nose and mouth for the duration of the event. Guests who do not adhere to the American Family Field mask policy will be asked to leave the event. Please refer to the [Brewers' Ballpark Information](#) for additional information.
