

### What is the Net Price Calculator?

The Net Price Calculator (NPC) is a tool for families to use to determine the estimated costs of a Marquette education. Families will enter their financial information (earnings, savings, other investments) and will be able to get an estimate on what they can expect to pay for their first year at Marquette. It is an informal FAFSA. In order to be considered for need based aid, we ask our undocumented and DACA students to complete this form.

### Where do I find the NPC and how do I submit it?

You can find the NPC on our website here: <http://www.marquette.edu/student-aid-calculator/>. Once you complete it, you will need to print out your results and mail, e-mail, or fax it to Marquette Central along with proof of income.

### What does Marquette do with the information I submit?

All information is strictly confidential. By entering your families' financial information and submitting proof of income, we will be able to come up with an "Expected Family Contribution" (EFC). We will use this number to determine how much aid you may be eligible for.

### When can I submit my NPC?

Please do not submit until **after you have been admitted**.

### What kind of "proof of income" do I need to submit?

Most students will submit their parents taxes (1040 form) from the "prior prior" year – for admission for Fall 2017, complete the NPC using your parent's 2015 tax information.

If your parents do not file taxes, please contact Marquette Central to find out what other documents you may be able to submit.

### Commonly asked questions about completing the NPC:

#### Can I complete the NPC in Spanish?

The Net Price Calculator can be completed in English or Spanish – simply select your language preference on the upper right hand corner.

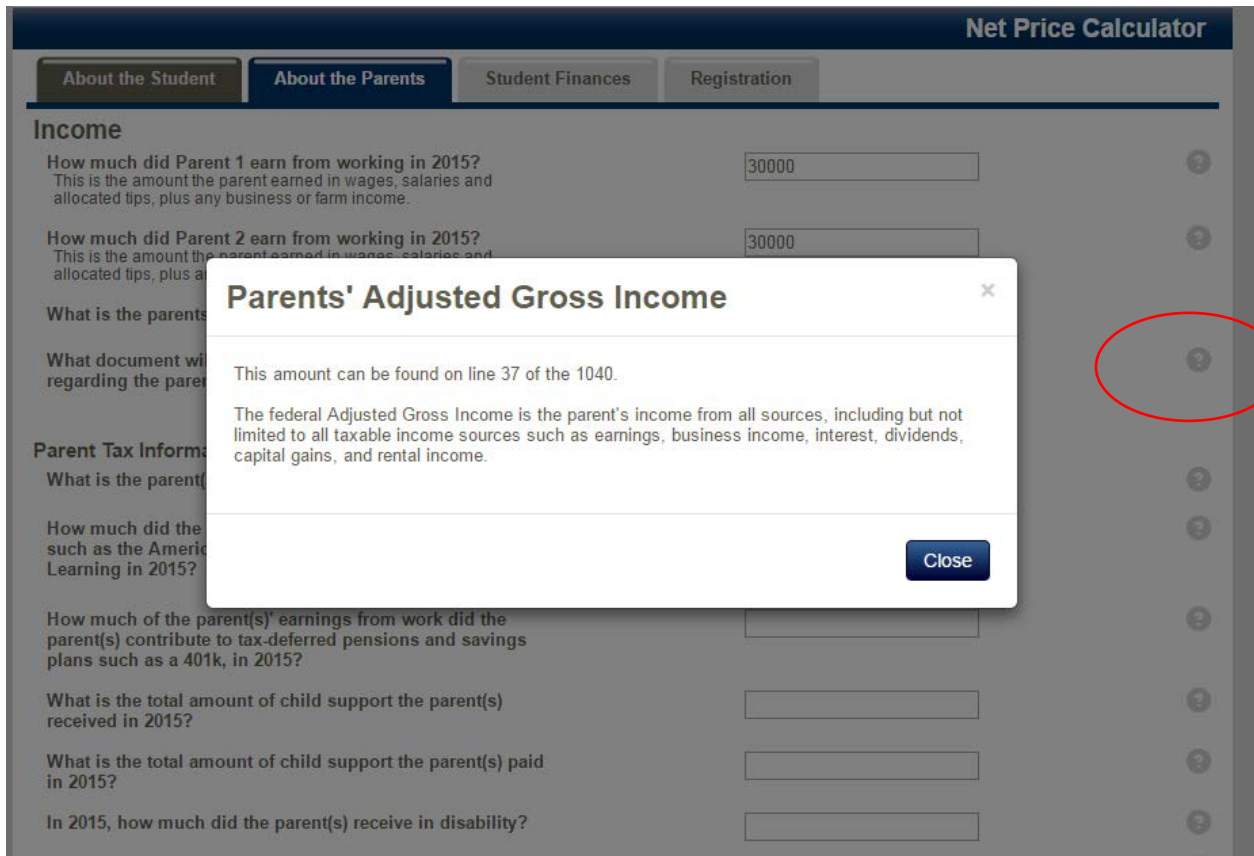
### **Why is it asking for my academic information?**

In addition to providing an estimate on how much your family can contribute to your Marquette education, the form also attempts to estimate how much you may receive in scholarships. This is a rough estimate and you should not expect to receive the amount given.

**Where do I find the information to complete the Income section?**

If your parents file taxes, their 1040 forms will be the easiest place to find the necessary information. Click on the question marks near each question on the NPC to find the specific line number where you can find the information requested.

If your parents do not file taxes, estimate or provide numbers from other proof of income documents.




**The form asks what my income was – what if I do not work?**

Enter 0s for all answers if you as the student do not earn any income.

**I have my results. What do I do now?**

Click on the “Data Summary” tab. Print and save this document and submit it to our financial aid office (see instructions in question 2). If you completed the form in Spanish, make sure to go back to the top of the page and click “English” again.
