DAY ONE

Start your morning in Racine, a historic community on the shores of Lake Michigan, at **Racine Art Museum**. Home to the largest contemporary craft collection in North America, Racine Art Museum's national reputation is built on its extensive collection, award-winning architecture and nationally recognized exhibition program.

Stop for lunch at **Red Onion Cafe**, a cozy cafe with delicious breakfast and lunch fare.

Rise and shine early, and strap on your walking shoes as you check out two impressive art museums in Milwaukee:


From its roots in Milwaukee's first art gallery in 1888, the Milwaukee Art Museum has grown today to be an icon for Milwaukee and a resource for the entire state, featuring 30,000 works of art. The museum includes the War Memorial Center designed by Finnish American architect Eero Saarinen, the Kahler Building by David Kahler, and the Quadracci Pavilion created by Spanish architect Santiago Calatrava.

Haggerty Museum of Art is the home of Marquette University's art collection. Boasting a collection of more than 10,000 objects, the Haggerty connects people—on campus, in the community, and around the world—to art, to ideas, and to one another through free-to-the-public exhibitions, collections, classes, programs and more.

Other cultural attractions in Milwaukee include Discovery World, Harley-Davidson Museum, Lynden Sculpture Gardens, Milwaukee Public Museum and Walker's Point Center for the Arts.

Visitors can also enjoy performances at the Marcus Center for the Performing Arts, Milwaukee Ballet, Milwaukee Repertory Theatre, Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra, Pabst Theater and Skylight Opera Theatre.

After an inspiring day of art, head to Madison where you can rest your head at **The Edgewater**, an urban luxury resort in the heart of downtown and within walking distance of the Capitol Square.



DAY THREE


If it's a Saturday, fuel up for the day with a visit to the **Dane County Farmers' Market**, America's largest producers-only farmers' market, where you can browse, sample and buy fresh Wisconsin products.

First up is a trip to the **Chazen Museum of Art**, located on the beautiful campus of the University of Wisconsin–Madison. Within the Chazen's 176,000 square feet of museum space is a collection of approximately 25,000 works of art covering diverse historical periods, cultures and geographic locations, from ancient Greece, Western Europe and the Soviet Empire to Moghul India, 18th-century Japan and modern Africa.

For lunch, enjoy delicious fare at **Graze**, a lively gastropub featuring farm-to-table comfort fare in a modern glass venue with Capitol views.

Then, in the afternoon, be enthralled by modern and contemporary art at the <u>Madison Museum of Contemporary Art</u>. The museum's collection includes nearly 6,000 objects, comprising one of the nation's finest collections of Chicago Imagism as well as significant holdings in Mexican Modernist prints, Wisconsin artists and contemporary photography.

Cap off your evening – and your trip – with a well-deserved Wisconsin Old Fashioned at (where else?) **The Old Fashioned**. Cheers!
