Speech Pathology & Audiology

UNDERGRADUATE MAJOR

The undergraduate major in **Speech Pathology and Audiology (SPPA)** provides the pre-professional preparation necessary to pursue the graduate education required to work as a clinical service provider. Speech-language pathologists and audiologists work in private practice, public and private schools, hospitals, clinics, developmental centers and rehabilitation centers.

Curriculum Overview:

- The SPPA major includes courses in the areas of normal speech production and development; disorders of speech, language and hearing; and methods of evaluation and treatment.
- A variety of elective courses in the major allow you to explore different areas within the field.
- In the clinical practicum courses, you will work with children and adults experiencing speech/language/hearing problems under the supervision of faculty. Up to 50 contact hours completed as an undergraduate student can be applied toward a future graduate program.
- Curriculum flexibility readily allows for study abroad and/or pursuing a second major or minor(s).
