SUMMARY

This project will complement the educational efforts to be established by promoting collaborative scholarship across disciplines among Marquette faculty, students and nonacademic partners in the areas on public health and global health, particularly those related to health equity and developing infrastructure that supports health equity-related research both within Marquette community and in partnership with the MCW.

DESCRIPTION

Disparities in health are among society's most pressing challenges and are prevalent in our own community and worldwide. We believe that Marquette has an obligation to work with community partners to address issues related to the widening disparities in health across racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups. This vision is supported by our goals: a) Establish a formal interdisciplinary Community of Research Scholars (CoRS); b) establish a partnership with new MS Program in Health Equity (MS GHE) at MCW; and c) develop high-impact learning opportunities related to health equity for Marquette students through a new undergraduate summer research program (SRP).
