### SUMMARY

The Milwaukee Trauma Outcomes Project (MTOP) seeks to advance research and community prevention efforts pertaining to trauma and the development of Posttraumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) among racial and ethnic minorities communities in Milwaukee.

# **DESCRIPTION**

The Milwaukee Trauma Outcomes Project (MTOP) seeks to advance research and community prevention efforts pertaining to trauma and the development of Posttraumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), particularly among racial and ethnic minorities living in Milwaukee. MTOP includes interdisciplinary scholars partnering to further understand the social and biological factors that contribute to PTSD. The structural inequities and increased exposure to traumatic experiences, including community violence and racial/ethnic discrimination, contribute to racial/ethnic health disparities. Still, our understanding is limited regarding how societal, environmental, cultural, and biological factors interact to cause mental health problems or promote resilience.

- 1. Convene group of MTOP researchers (completed)
- 2. Establish research partnerships with community stakeholders (6-8 months)
- 3. MTOP researchers will prepare and begin data collection for hospital research study (10-12 months)
