Effective fall 2010, the U.S. Department of Education required all colleges/universities to change the way race/ethnicity data is collected and reported. Starting in fall 2010, the “Asian and Pacific Islander” category is disaggregated into “Asian” and “Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander”, and employees and students selecting multiple races are categorized as “Two or More Races.” Because of these significant changes, time series of individual race/ethnicity categories should be analyzed with caution.
