History:

1890s	Jesuits (Turin Province) visited Kaltag (Koyukon)
1901-1948, 1950-1952	Jesuits (formerly California; now Oregon Province, Portland, Oregon) established and attended St. Teresa/ Little Flower of Jesus Mission (Koyukon) from Our Lady, Nulato
1948-1950, 1952-1955	Jesuits attended St. Teresa's from St. John's, Galena
1955-1956	A Jesuit attended St. Teresa's from St. Michael's, St. Michael
1956-1985	Jesuits administered St. Teresa's
1979-present	Various women religious also ministered to St. Teresa's from the Sisters of Notre Dame, School Sisters of Notre Dame, and Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary
1985-1986	Various Jesuits attended St. Teresa's from unknown parish, Anchorage, St. Mary's, St. Marys, and St. Lawrence, Mountain Village
1986-1992, 1994-present	Franciscans (Sacred Heart Province, St. Louis, Missouri) have administered St. Teresa's
1992	A diocesan priest administered St. Teresa's
1992-1994	A diocesan priest attended St. Teresa's from Our Lady, Nulato

Jesuits from St. Teresa's attended the following Indian and Eskimo missions:

1980s (transferred to Holy Family, Glenallen)	St. Francis Regis Mission (Koyukon), Huslia
1980s	St. Michael Mission (Eskimo), McGrath
