History: St. Gregory of Nazianzen Church is a partially Tlingit Indian parish.

1873, 1879	Arch/bishop Charles J. Seghers visited Sitka (Tlingit) from St. Andrew's, Victoria, British Columbia, Canada
1885-1889	Diocesan priests attended Sitka station (Tlingit) from St. Andrew's, Victoria, British Columbia, Canada
1889-1890	Jesuits (formerly Turin and Canadian; then California Province, Los Gatos, California) attended Sitka station from St. Rose, Wrangell
1890-1898	Jesuits attended Sitka station from Nativity, Juneau
1898-1902	Jesuits attended Sitka station from Our Lady, Douglas
1902-1920	Jesuits attended Sitka station from St. Mark's, Skagway
1920-1930	Jesuits attended Sitka station from Nativity, Juneau
1930-present	Diocesan priests established and have administered St. Gregory of Nazianzen Church

Diocesan priests from St. Gregory's attended Sacred Heart Mission (Tlingit), Hoonah, 1960-1976 (transferred to Nativity, Juneau)
