History: St. Rose of Lima Church is a partially Tlingit Indian parish.

1879-1886	Reverend John Althoff from St. Andrew Cathedral, Victoria, British Columbia, Canada established and diocesan priests administered St. Rose of Lima Church
1886-1896	Jesuits (formerly Turin, Canada, and California; now Oregon Province, Portland, Oregon) administered St. Rose
1898-1909	Jesuits attended St. Rose from Our Lady of the Mines, Douglas
1909-1930	Diocesan priests attended St. Rose from Holy Name, Ketchikan
1930-1940	Jesuits administered St. Rose
1940-1980	Diocesan priests administered St. Rose
1980-1990	Oblates of Mary Immaculate (United States Province) administered St. Rose
1990-present	Diocesan priests have administered St. Rose
