History: In 1969 the Diocese of Phoenix was erected for central Arizona from portions of the Diocese of Tucson. The Phoenix Diocese reported 44,000 baptized Native American Catholics in 1999. Phoenix and its predecessors have administered the following Indian missions, parishes, and schools:

History of St. John the Baptist Church and School, Laveen

1897-1909	Franciscans (formerly St. John the Baptist; now Santa Barbara Province, Oakland, California) from Immaculate Conception, Phoenix established and administered St. John the Baptist Church (Pima), Laveen/ Komat or Komatke, Gila River Reservation
1898-1901	Franciscans established and administered St. John the Baptist School (Pima), Gila River Reservation
1901-1930	Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet (Los Angeles Province, Los Angeles, California) staffed the school
1910-present	Franciscans have administered St. John's
1931-1936	Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange (Orange, California) staffed the school
1938-1990 (closed)	Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity (Manitowoc, Wisconsin) staffed the school (later Apache, Pima, and Tohono O'odham)
1980-1990 (closed)	Christian Brothers (San Francisco Province, Napa, California) also staffed the school

- H. Phoenix, St. Mary Basilica/ Immaculate Conception Church, 1885-1926; believed to include several attended Indian missions, St. Lucy/ Ss. Simon and Jude Mission, Gila Bend, 1885-1914, St. John the Baptist Mission, Laveen, 1897-1909, St. Francis of Assisi Mission, Salt River, 1902-1912, Phoenix Government School, Phoenix, 1905-1930, St. Anne Mission, Santan, 1906-1909, St. Michael Mission, Sacaton Flats, 1906-1909, St. Paschal Mission, Blackwater, 1906-1909, St. Peter Mission, Casa Blanca, 1906-1909, and Our Lady of Guadalupe Mission, Guadalupe, 1906-1926
