Description: Description: Within the Archives, records are accessible via an in-house electronic index, which has identified persons from the following groups as notable authors: Bishops of the Archdiocese of Santa Fe and Diocese of Gallup, directors of the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions, Saint Katharine Drexel, S.B.S., the Marquette League for Catholic Indian Missions, Franciscan provincials of Our Lady of Guadalupe and St. John the Baptist Provinces, and Navajo-English translators A.G. "Chic" Sandoval (Navajo) and Helen and Lorenzo Yazzie (Navajo).
