Description: The collection contains the papers of Rupert Costo (1906-1989) (Cahuilla) and Jeanette Dulce Costo (1906-2001) (Cherokee) and the records of the American Indian Historical Society (1964-1988). It includes correspondence, articles, clippings, and research notes, ca. 1975-1980; notable correspondents include Reverend Emmett Hoffman, St. Labre School, Northern Cheyenne Reservation, Ashland, Montana, 1975, and the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions, 1978.
