History: St. Clement Church is a non-Indian parish. However, Franciscans from St. Clement's attended St. Mary Mission (Ojibwa and Ottawa), Burt Lake.

History of St. Mary Mission

1829	Reverend Peter DeJean visited Sheboygan Village (Ojibwa and Ottawa) from St. Peter's, Harbor Springs
1830	Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Sheboygan Village, built
1830-1929	Diocesan priests established and attended St. Mary's From Holy Childhood/ St. Peter's, Harbor Springs
ca. 1840s-ca. 1860s	Lay teachers staffed a parish school
1929-1947	Franciscans (unknown) attended St. Mary's from St. Francis Xavier, Petoskey
1947-present	Franciscans attended St. Mary's from St. Clement's
