History: St. Michael Church is a non-Indian parish administered by diocesan priests (Diocese of Crookston) from St. Philip Church, Bemidji. Diocesan priests from St. Michael's, Northome/ Killiher, have attended St. Catherine Mission (Ojibwa), Squaw Lake.

History of St. Catherine Mission

1936-1948	Benedictines (St. John's Abbey, Collegeville, Minnesota) established and attended Squaw Lake station (Ojibwa) from St. Joseph's, Ball Club
1948-1962	Benedictines established and attended St. Catherine Mission (Ojibwa) from St. Joseph's, Ball Club
1962-1969	Oblates of Mary Immaculate (Central Province, St. Paul, Minnesota) attended St. Catherine's from St. Michael's, Northome
1969-1979	Became a parish; Oblates of Mary Immaculate administered St. Catherine Church
1979-1981	Oblates of Mary Immaculate attended St. Catherine's from St. Michael's, Northome
1981-present	Diocesan priests have attended St. Catherine's from St. Michael's, Northome

Oblates of Mary Immaculate from St. Catherine's attended Inger station (Ojibwa), 1974-1979 (closed).
