History: In 1997, to better serve the Chicago, Detroit, Missouri, and Wisconsin Provinces, these four provinces of the Society of Jesus combined their archival holdings and established the Midwest Jesuit Archives in St. Louis. However, per previously established agreements, most records pertaining to the Native American ministries of the Wisconsin Province remained at, and continue to be transferred to, Marquette University, Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

History of the Chicago Province

The Chicago Jesuit Province was established in 1928. From 1947-1955, Jesuits from the province evangelized the Ojibwa Indians of the eastern portion of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. St. Isaac Jogues Church, Sault Sainte Marie, served as the center of the Indian mission activities.

History of the Detroit Province

The Detroit Jesuit Province was established in 1955 from portions of the Chicago Province. From 1947-1955 and in 1949, Jesuits from the Chicago Province evangelized the Ojibwa Indians of the eastern half of Michigan's Upper Peninsula. St. Isaac Jogues Church, Sault Sainte Marie, became the center of Jesuit Indian mission activities in this region. From 1955-ca. 1995, Jesuits from the Detroit Province administered St. Isaac Jogues Church.

History of the Missouri Province and the Missouri and Rocky Mountain Missions

The Jesuit Missouri Province was established in 1863. It succeeded the Missouri Mission (established, 1823), which along with the Rocky Mountain Mission, were administered by the Maryland Province. The Missouri and Rocky Mountain Missions and the Missouri Province administered the following Indian missions, parishes, and schools.

History of the Wisconsin Province

The Wisconsin Jesuit Province was established in 1955 from portions of the Missouri Province. In 1997, to better serve the Chicago, Missouri, and Wisconsin Provinces, the three provinces established a combined Midwest Jesuit Archives, St. Louis, Missouri.
