| 1892 | Jesuits (formerly Turin and California; now Oregon Province, Portland, Oregon) established St. Charles Borromeo Mission (Crow), Crow Reservation |
| 1892-1898 (closed) | Ursulines (Western Province, Great Falls, Montana) staffed St. Charles Borromeo School |
| 1893-1936 | Jesuits attended St. Charles from St. Francis Xavier, St. Xavier |
| 1925-1930s | Capuchins (St. Joseph Province, Detroit, Michigan) reopened and staffed the school |
| 1935-present | Congregation of the Sisters of the Third Order of St Francis (Oldenburg, Indiana) have staffed the school |
| 1936-1966 | Jesuits administered St. Charles |
| 1967-present | Became a parish; Capuchins have administered St. Charles Church |
