History:

1936-1990s	Benedictine Sisters (formerly Immaculate Conception Abbey; now Queen of Peace Abbey, Belcourt, North Dakota) established and taught at St. Ann School (Métis and Ojibwa)
1974-present	A community corporation (Métis and Ojibwa) has administered Ojibwa Indian/ St. Ann School, Turtle Mountain Reservation

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: 1947-1974

Volume: Approximately 6 cubic feet

Description: The records at the Ojibwa Indian School are not organized according to a classification scheme. Consequently, description is by record type.

- A. Student records, 1947-1974, 6 cubic feet; records when school was known as St. Ann School
- B. Attendance reports submitted to the State of North Dakota, 1965-1974, .1 cubic foot; records when school was known as St. Ann School
