History:

1908	A diocesan priest established a residence in Winnebago, Winnebago Reservation
1909-present	Diocesan priests established and have administered St. Augustine Mission and School (Winnebago and Omaha)
1909-1945	Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament (Bensalem, Pennsylvania) staffed the school
1945	Sisters of Notre Dame (Covington, Kentucky) staffed the school
1945-1957	Lay teachers staffed the school
1957-1982	Missionary Benedictine Sisters (Norfolk, Nebraska) staffed the school

From 1931-present, diocesan priests from St. Augustine Church attended the following Indian mission and station among the Omaha Indians:

1931-1947	Macy station
1947-present	Our Lady of Fatima Mission, Macy
