History:

1890s-1940s	Franciscans (St. John the Baptist Province, Cincinnati, Ohio) established and attended St. Francis of Assisi Mission (Apache), Jicarilla Reservation, from Sacred Heart, Farmington
1915-1990s	Franciscans established and the Sisters of St. Francis of Perpetual Adoration (St. Joseph Province, Colorado Springs, Colorado) administered and staffed St. Francis School (Apache)
1950-1981	Became a parish; Franciscans administered St. Francis of Assisi Church
1981-present	Diocesan priests have administered the parish
1995-1996	The school staff included a Sister of Notre Dame de Namur (California Province, Belmont, California)
1997-2000	The Missionary Servants of the Most Blessed Trinity (Arlington, Virginia) administered and staffed the school
2000-present	Laity have administered and staffed the school

Franciscans and diocesan priests from St. Francis have attended St. Anthony Mission (Apache), Dulce, Jicarilla Reservation, 1970-present.
