History: The Cathedral of the Sacred Heart is a non-Indian parish that has had a few Navajo and other Indian parishioners. Furthermore, diocesan priests from Sacred Heart attended the following Indian missions in New Mexico:

1899-1920 (became a parish)	Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe de Halona Mission (Zuni), Zuni Pueblo, Zuni Reservation
1900-1910 (became a parish)	St. Joseph Mission (Laguna), Laguna Pueblo, Laguna Reservation
1900-1920 (transferred to St. Joseph's, Laguna)	San Estevan del Rey Mission (Acoma), Acoma Pueblo, Acoma Reservation
1948-1950 (transferred to St. Mary's, Tohatchi)	St. Anthony Mission (Navajo), Naschitti, Navajo Reservation
1948-1950 (became a parish)	St. Mary/ Immaculate Conception Mission (Navajo), Tohatchi, Navajo Reservation

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: ca. 1899-present

Volume: Several entries among 31 volumes

Description: Sacramental records for Sacred Heart Cathedral and its attended Indian missions, including baptisms, 18 volumes; and first communions, confirmations, marriages, and burials, 13 volumes.
