History:

1906-1999	Sister M. Mathias Boyle, O.S.F., and the Poor Sisters of St. Francis Seraph of the Perpetual Adoration (formerly Immaculate Heart of Mary; now St. Joseph Province, Colorado Springs, Colorado) established and staffed the San Diego/Jemez Day School (Jemez)
1997-2005? (transferred to a community corporation)	The school became first an independent Catholic school named "San Diego Riverside School" and then a public charter school renamed "San Diego Riverside Charter School"

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: 1972-present

Volume: Approximately 10 cubic feet

Description: The school records at San Diego Riverside School are not arranged according to a classification scheme. Consequently, description is by record type.

- A. Correspondence, 1980-present, approximately 8 cubic feet; re: transition from parish to charter school
- B. Student cumulative files, 1972-1995, approximately 2 cubic feet
