Inclusive dates: 1729-2003

Volume: Less than 1 cubic foot

Description: 9 collections include Native Catholic records.

/1 "Amador Family Papers, Ms 4"

Inclusive dates: 1836-1949

Volume: Approximately 11 photographs

Description: Papers of Martin and Rrefugio Ruiz de Amador and their children; include photographs of Our Lady of Guadalupe Mission, Juarez, Mexico, San Gabriel Arcángel Mission, San Gabriel, California, Santa Barbara Mission, Santa Barbara, California, and the Junipero Serra Monument, Monterey, California.

/2 "Elizabeth Barrett Photograph Collection, Ms 222"

Inclusive dates: 1924, n.d.

Volume: At least 11 photographs

Description: An unprocessed collection; Matachine dancers at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church (Tortugas), Mesilla Park, New Mexico.

/3 "Fabian Garcia Papers, Ms 71"

Inclusive dates: Between 1890-1940

Volume: Few photographs

Description: San Gabriel Arcángel Mission, San Gabriel, California.

/4 "Hagerman Family Papers, Ms 104"

Inclusive dates: Between 1848-1937

Volume: At least 9 photographs

Description: A partially processed collection; San José y San Miguel Mission, San Antonio, Texas and San Xavier del Bac Mission, Tucson, Arizona.

/5 "Los Archivos Históricos del Arzobispado de Durango, México, Ms 355"

Inclusive dates: 1729-1860

Volume: Approximately 1% within 730 reels of microfilm

Description: Records (copies) from the Archdiocese and State of Durango (Archivo General de Notarías de Durango); includes Franciscan and Jesuit Indian missions and parishes in New Mexico and El Paso, Texas; in Spanish.

/6 "Carl Schuchard Lithographs, Ms 0339"

Inclusive dates: 1854

Volume: 2 photographs

Description: San José de Tumacácori Mission, Tumacacori, Arizona; from drawings by Schuchard made during the A.B. Gray Survey for a southern transcontinental railroad.

/7 "Thomas K. Todsén Photographs, Ms 0223"

Inclusive dates: Unknown

Volume: Approximately 5 postcards

Description: St. Joseph Mission, Mescalero, New Mexico, San Geronimo Mission, Taos, New Mexico, and San Augustine Church, Isleta, New Mexico.

/8 "Keith Wilson Papers, Ms 0451"

Inclusive dates: Between 1957-2003

Volume: 6 folders

Description: A New Mexico author, poet and professor; includes the manuscript, "Missions and Pueblos of the Old Southwest" with related photographic prints and negatives of the following 20 mission churches:
