History:

1598-1680, 1692-1852	Franciscans (Santo Evangelico Province, Mexico City, Mexico) established and administered St. John the Baptist/ San Juan de Los Caballeros Chapel (Tewa), Ohkay Owingeh/ San Juan Pueblo
1852-present	Diocesan priests have administered St. John's
1887-1896	Diocesan priests established and staffed San Juan School (Tewa) at the parish
1889-present	Diocesan priests established and also administered Sainte Chapelle Chapel (Tewa) at the parish
1925-1949	Dominican Sisters (Congregation of our Lady of the Sacred Heart, Grand Rapids, Michigan) staffed the school
1929-1949	Dominican Sisters (Congregation of the Sisters of St. Dominic of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Akron, Ohio) staffed the school
1949-1968 (closed)	Dominican Sisters (Dominican Sisters of the Third Order of St. Dominic, Grand Rapids, Michigan) staffed the school
