History:

1852-1868	Diocesan priests established and attended Our Lady of Guadalupe/ Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe Church (Cochiti), Cochiti Reservation, from St. Dominic's, Santo Domingo Pueblo
1868-1900	Diocesan priests administered Our Lady of Guadalupe
1889-1891	A school was staffed at the parish
1900-present	Franciscans (formerly St. John the Baptist; now Our Lady of Guadalupe Province, Albuquerque, New Mexico) have administered Our Lady of Guadalupe
1904-1970 (closed)	Poor Sisters of St. Francis Seraph of the Perpetual Adoration (Immaculate Heart of Mary Province, Mishawaka, Indiana) established and staffed Our Lady of Guadalupe School (Cochiti)
1970-present	Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored People (Bensalem, Pennsylvania) staffed the school

Franciscans and diocesan priests from Our Lady of Guadalupe attended the following Indian missions:

1868-present	St. Dominic/ Santo Domingo de Guzmán Mission (Santo Domingo), Santo Domingo Pueblo
1868-present	San Buenaventura Mission (Cochiti), Cochiti Pueblo, Cochiti Reservation

Inclusive dates: 1887-present

Description: Sacramental records **for** Our Lady of Guadalupe Church and its attended Indian missions; in Latin to 1940s.
