History: The Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi is a non-Indian parish that has included a few Indian parishioners. Furthermore, diocesan priests, 1848-1901, and Franciscans (formerly St. John the Baptist; now Our Lady of Guadalupe Province, Albuquerque, New Mexico), 1901-2000, attended the following Indian missions:

1848-1854 (transferred to St. Augustine, Isleta)	San Estevan del Rey Mission (Acoma), Acoma Pueblo, Acoma Reservation
1852-1854 (transferred to St. Augustine, Isleta)	San José Mission (Laguna), Laguna Pueblo, Laguna Reservation
1852-1854 (transferred to St. Augustine, Isleta)	Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe Mission (Zuni), Zuni Pueblo, Zuni Reservation
1852-2000 (transferred to Franciscan Tewa Missions, Espanola)	San Diego Mission (Tewa), Tesuque Pueblo, Tesuque Reservation
1852-1857 (transferred to Holy Cross, Santa Cruz)	San Francisco Mission (Tewa), Nambe Pueblo, Nambe Reservation
1853-1856 (transferred to San Ildefonso, San Ildefonso)	Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe Mission (Tewa), Pojoaque Pueblo, Pojoaque Reservation
1947-2000 (transferred to Franciscan Tewa Missions, Espanola)	Santa Clara Mission (Tewa), Santa Clara Pueblo, Santa Clara Reservation
1947-2000 (transferred to Franciscan Tewa Missions, Espanola)	San Ildefonso Mission (Tewa), San Ildefonso Pueblo, San Ildefonso Reservation
