| 1707-1782 | Franciscans (Santo Evangelico Province, Mexico City, Mexico) established and attended Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe del Valle de Pojoaque Mission (Tewa) from San Francisco, Nambé Pueblo |
| 1782-1852 | Franciscans administered Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe |
| 1853-1856 | Diocesan priests attended Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe from San Francisco, Santa Fé |
| 1858-1878 | Diocesan priests attended Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe from San Ildefonso, San Ildefonso |
| 1879-1920 | Diocesan priests attended Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe from Santa Cruz, Santa Cruz |
| 1920-1959 | Sons of the Holy Family (Silver Spring, Maryland) attended Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe from Santa Cruz, Santa Cruz |
| 1959-present | Became a parish; diocesan priests have administered Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe del Valle de Pojoaque Church |

History of San Francisco de Nambé Mission

| 1859-1920 | Diocesan priests attended San Francisco from Santa Cruz, Santa Cruz |

1920-1959	Sons of the Holy Family attended San Francisco from Santa Cruz, Santa Cruz
1959-1969	Diocesan priests attended San Francisco from Sacred Heart, Nambe Pueblo
1969-present	Diocesan priests attended San Francisco from Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe

Franciscans from San Francisco attended Nuestra Senora de Guadalupe, 1707-1782 (became a parish).
