History:

1622	Franciscans (Santo Evangelico Province, Mexico City, Mexico) began evangelizing Abó
1620s-1672 to 1678 (closed)	Franciscans established and administered San Gregorio de Abó Mission (Piro and Tiwa), Abó
1620s-1670s (closed)	Franciscans established and administered San Buenaventura de las Gran Quivira Mission (Piro and Tiwa), Gran Quivira
1628-1677 (closed)	Franciscans established and administered Nuestra Señora de la Purísima Concepción de Quarai Mission (Piro and Tiwa), until abandoned for Tajique
1680	Survivors of the Pueblo revolt from San Gregorio, Nuestra Señora de Purísima Concepción, and San Buenaventura settled in the area of El Paso del Norte, Texas
