| 1892-1899 | Diocesan priests attended Claremore station (Cherokee) from Assumption Church, Muskogee |

| 1899-1909 | Diocesan priests attended Claremore station from Holy Family, Tulsa |
| 1909-1912 | Diocesan priests attended Claremore station from Sacred Heart, Sapulpa |
| 1912-1914 | Diocesan priests attended Claremore station from St. Catherine's, Nowata |
| 1914-1917 | Diocesan priests attended Claremore station from Holy Cross, Wagoner |
| 1917-1920 | Diocesan priests established and attended Sacred Heart Mission (Cherokee) from Holy Family, Tulsa |
| 1920-1925 | Diocesan priests attended Sacred Heart from St. Patrick's, Sand Springs |
| 1925-1931 (closed) | Society of the Precious Blood (Cincinnati Province, Cincinnati, Ohio) attended Sacred Heart from St. Catherine's, Nowata |
| 1931-1939 | Society of the Precious Blood attended Claremore station (Cherokee) from St. Catherine's, Nowata |
| 1939-1940 | Diocesan priests attended Claremore station |
| 1940-1948 | Diocesan priests established and attended Christ the King Mission (Cherokee) from Sacred Heart, Skiatook |
| 1948-present | Became a parish; diocesan priests administered St. Cecilia/Christ the King Church |
