History: Holy Rosary Church is a non-Indian parish. However, from Holy Rosary, Discalced Carmelites (now Province of St. Therese of Oklahoma, Little Rock, Arkansas) and Carmelites of St. Therese attended the following Indian missions and station:

1910-1916 (became a mission)	Pittsburg station (various)
1910-1916, 1926-1977	St. Edward Church/ Mission (various), Pittsburg
1918-1921 (closed)	St. Henry Mission (Choctaw), Bentley

History of St. Edward Church and School

1910-1916	Discalced Carmelites attended Pittsburg station from Holy Rosary, Hartshorne
1916-1926	Discalced Carmelites established and administered St. Edward Church
1918-1919	Carmelites of St. Therese (now Oklahoma City, Oklahoma) established and staffed St. Edward School (various)
1919-1925	Benedictine Sisters (now Tulsa, Oklahoma) staffed the school
1925-1927 (closed)	Carmelites of St. Therese staffed the school
1926-1977	Discalced Carmelites and Carmelites of St. Therese attended St. Edward's from Holy Rosary, Hartshorne
1977-present	Diocesan priests attended St. Edward's from St. John's, McAlester
