History: St. Joseph Church is a non-Indian parish. However, Benedictines (now St. Benedict's Abbey, Shawnee, Oklahoma) from St. Joseph's attended the following Indian stations:

1889-1890 (transferred to Sacred Heart, El Reno)	Fort Reno station (Cheyenne)
1889-1892 (transferred to St. Patrick's, Anadarko)	Cheyenne and Arapaho Reservation station
1889-ca. 1894 (closed)	Iowa Reservation station
1889-ca. 1894 (closed)	Kickapoo Reservation station
1889-1895 (transferred to St. Felix's, Ponca City)	Otoe Reservation station
1889-ca. 1894 (transferred to St. John's, Gray Horse)	Pawnee Reservation station
1889-1895 (transferred to St. Felix's, Ponca City)	Ponca Reservation station
