History: Holy Family Cathedral is a non-Indian parish, which had a school that included a few American Indian students (various). Also, diocesan priests from Holy Family attended the following Indian missions and stations:

1899-1905 (closed)	St. Anthony Mission (Delaware), Lenapa
1899-1907 (closed)	Twin Mounds station (Creek and Yuchi)
1899-1909 (transferred to Sacred Heart, Sapulpa)	Claremore station (Cherokee)
1899-1907 (became a mission)	Sapulpa station (Creek)
1907-1909 (became a parish) (no longer Indian)	Sacred Heart Mission (Creek), Sapulpa
1899-1909 (closed)	Talala station (Creek and Yuchi)
1899-1910 (closed)	Red Fork station (Creek and Yuchi)
1917-1920 (transferred to St. Patrick's, Sand Springs)	Sacred Heart Mission (Cherokee), Claremore
