History: The Diocese of Baker City was erected from a portion of the Archdiocese of Portland in 1903 and renamed the Diocese of Baker in 1952. In 1999 the Baker Diocese reported fewer than 1,000 baptized Native American Catholics. Baker and its predecessors have administered the following Indian missions, parishes, and schools in Oregon:

Description: Includes diocesan and religious priests, 1 folder/person arranged alphabetically

Inclusive dates: ca. 1910-present

Volume: Approximately .2 cubic foot

Description: Correspondence between the diocese and the Jesuits; re: Native Americans evangelization and St. Andrew Mission, Pendleton.

/5 Files of Other Organizations

Inclusive dates: 1908-present

Volume: Several folders

Description: Correspondence between the diocese and Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions, Commission for the Catholic Missions Among the Colored People and the Indians, and Catholic Historical Society (Portland, Oregon).

/6 Archdiocesan Newspaper

Inclusive dates: 1870-present

Volume: Few articles

Description: The Catholic Sentinel, http://www.sentinel.org/, has included occasional articles on American Indians and Catholic evangelization throughout Oregon. It was established in 1870 and acquired by the Archdiocese of Portland, ca. 1920, when it became the official newspaper for both Portland and Baker.
