Description: Sacramental records (transcribed copies), including baptisms, first communions, confirmations, marriages, and burials for the following missions and parishes, some of which had few Indian parishioners:

- A. Corvallis, St. Mary Church (Chinook and Klamath)
- B. Grand Ronde, St. Michael the Archangel Mission (Grand Ronde)
- C. McMinnville, St. James Church (Grand Ronde)
- D. Portland, Immaculate Conception Church (Paiute, Walla Walla, and Wasco)
- E. Siletz Reservation, St. Mary Mission (Chinook, Klamath, and Siletz)
- F. St. Paul/ Willamette, St. Paul Mission (Cayuse, Métis, and others)
