Bishops' Papers, Bishop Martin Marty, O.S.B. (1834-1896): In *Bishop Martin Marty, "The Black Robe Lean Chief,"* ca. 1980, Robert F. Karolevitz states that in 1896 most papers of Bishop Marty were destroyed by his successor, Bishop Thomas O'Gorman.

Description: This series consists of correspondence and is arranged alphabetically by location of the mission or the name of the institution or the order.

- A. "Blue Cloud Abbey," 1969-1978, .15 cubic foot: major correspondents include Bishop Lambert Hoch, Abbot Gilbert Hess, O.S.B., and Abbot Alan Berndt, O.S.B.

- B. "Chamberlain, St. Joseph's Indian School," 1927-1967, .1 cubic foot: major correspondents include Reverend Henry Hogeback, S.C.J., Reverend Joseph Speyer, S.C.J., Reverend Richard Kiefer, S.C.J., Reverend Gregory Bezy, S.C.J., Reverend George Pinger, S.C.J., Reverend Jude Blaszyk, S.C.J., Bishop Bernard J. Mahoney, Bishop William O. Brady, and Bishop Lambert Hoch
- C. "Flandreau, Ss. Simon and Jude Church," 1946-1964, 1 folder: correspondence contains references to the Flandreau Government Indian School; major correspondents include Reverend George E. Kelly, Reverend Felix McCabe, Bishop William Brady, and Bishop Lambert Hoch
- D. "Marty, St. Paul's Mission and School," 1926, 1930, 1934-1943, 1946-1978, .4 cubic foot: major correspondents include Reverend Sylvester Eisenman, O.S.B., Reverend Gaulbert Brunsman, O.S.B., Reverend George Lyon, O.S.B., Reverend Michael O'Reilly, O.S.B., Bishop Bernard Mahoney, Bishop William Brady, Bishop Lambert Hoch, and the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions
- E. "Marty Oblate Sisters," (Oblate Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, Marty, South Dakota), 1930s-1967, 1974-1978, .3 cubic foot: major correspondents include the sister superiors at the motherhouse, Bishop Bernard Mahoney, Bishop William Brady, Bishop Lambert Hoch, and Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, Bensalem, Pennsylvania
- F. "Sisseton, St. Peter's Church and Tekakwitha Mission and Orphanage," 1934-1967, .2 cubic foot: major correspondents include Reverend John Pohlen, O.S.B., Bishop Bernard Mahoney, Bishop William Brady, and Bishop Lambert Hoch
- G. "Stephan, Immaculate Conception Mission and School, and Fort Thompson, St. Joseph's Church," 1897, 1933-1968, .1 cubic foot: major correspondents include Reverend Justin Snyder, O.S.B., Reverend Augustine Edele, O.S.B., Bishop Bernard Mahoney, Bishop William Brady, and Bishop Lambert Hoch

Inclusive dates: 1914-present

Volume: .4 cubic foot

Description: This series is arranged alphabetically by location of the mission. Reports appear annually for each Indian mission.

/3 Sacramental Records

Inclusive dates: 1839-1957

Volume: 6 reels of microfilm

Description: This series is on microfilm and is arranged alphabetically by location of the mission. The sacramental records were filmed in 1957.
