History: The Diocese of Dallas was erected in 1890 from a portion of the Diocese of Galveston. The Dallas Diocese administered the following Indian missions in Texas:

1682-present (Dallas, 1890-1914)	Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church/ Mission Corpus Christi de la Isleta Mission (Tiwa), El Paso/ Ysleta del Sur
1683-1687, 1715-1717, 1730-1810 (closed) (Dallas, 1890)	La Navidad en las Cruces Mission (Jumano), [Presidio]
1684-unknown (Dallas, 1890)	Santa María de la Redonda de los Cibolos Mission (Jumano), [Shafter]
1872-ca. 1900 (no longer Indian) (Dallas, 1890-ca. 1900)	San Elizario Mission (Tiwa and Mestizos), San Elizario
1881-ca. 1900 (no longer Indian) (Dallas, 1890-ca. 1900)	Nuestra Señora de la Limpia Concepción del Socorro Mission (Tiwa and Mestizos) Socorro/ Socorro del Sur

Description: Bishops' Papers, re: visitations to El Paso, which refer to the population as "Mexican" and not Tiwa Indian.
