Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: ca. 1700-present

Volume: Approximately 1 cubic foot

Description: The records at San Antonio Missions National Historic Park pertain to the Spanish Franciscan mission sites of Nuestra Señora de la Purísima Concepción de Acuña, San Francisco de la Espada, San Jose y San Miguel de Aguayo, and San Juan Capistrano missions, San Antonio, Texas. Because the holdings are not arranged according to a classification scheme, the description is by record type.
