History: Immaculate Conception Church is a non-Indian parish that has had a number of Indian parishioners and students.

1852-1883	Jesuits (formerly Turin and California; then Oregon Province, Portland, Oregon) established and attended Immaculate Conception Mission (Chelan, Entiat, Methow, Nespelim, Nez Perce, Okanogan, Paloos, Sanpoil, Senijextee, and Wenatchi) from St. Paul's, Colville
1873-1921	Sisters of Charity of Providence (formerly St. Ignatius; now Mother Joseph Province, Seattle, Washington) staffed Sacred Heart School (Chelan, Entiat, Methow, Nespelim, Nez Perce, Okanogan, Paloos, Sanpoil, Senijextee, and Wenatchi), Colville
1883-1920s	Jesuits attended Immaculate Conception from St. Francis, Colville
1920-ca. 1950 (no longer Indian)	Became a parish; Jesuits administered Immaculate Conception Church
