- B. Scrapbook, 1920s-1930s, 150 pages: compiled by a sister who taught at St. Anthony's from 1928-1936; contains copies of correspondence, historical notes, and photographs
- C. Histories, 1928, 1930s, n.d., 5 items: include a 15 page handwritten history of the Neopit Mission written in the 1930s by Sister M. Gregory, O.S.F., who taught at St. Anthony's
- D. List of students at St. Anthony School, 1932-1933
- E. Photographs, 1913-1920s, 10 prints
