History:

1909-1931	Franciscans (Sacred Heart Province, St. Louis, Missouri) established and attended St. Anthony Mission (Menominee), Keshena, Menominee Reservation
1913-1936	Sisters of St. Francis of the Holy Cross (Green Bay, Wisconsin) established and staffed St. Anthony School
1931-1975	Became a parish; Franciscans administered St. Anthony Church
1936-present	Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity (Manitowoc, Wisconsin) have staffed the school
1975-present	Diocesan priests have administered St. Anthony Church

Holdings of Catholic-related records about Native Americans:

Inclusive dates: 1909-present

Volume: 5 cubic feet

Description: The records at St. Anthony Church are not organized according to a classification scheme. Consequently, the description is by record type.

At the Rectory

- A. Sacramental records, 1909-present, 7 volumes: baptisms, marriages, and deaths, 1909-present; and first communions and confirmations, 1910-present

At the School

- A. Student records, 1913-present, 3 cubic feet: inactive files are arranged alphabetically and typically consist of a cumulative record card for each student containing biographical information and grades; active files are arranged by grade and chronologically thereunder and typically contain biographical information, grades, attendance, progress reports, registration forms, and medical records

B. "Administration," 1960s-present, 1 cubic foot: alphabetical subject file
