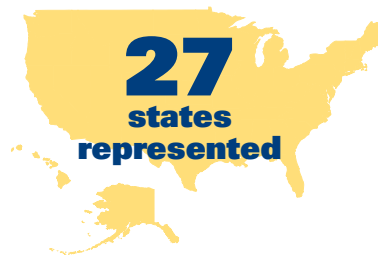

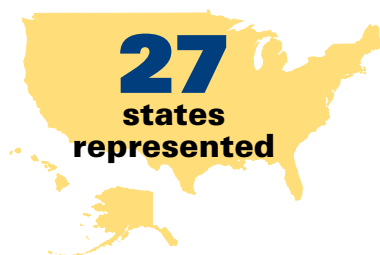

ADVANCED PRACTICE SPECIALTIES

Marquette has advanced practice specialties, most offered at the M.S.N. and D.N.P. level.

Doctoral education includes Doctor of Nursing Practice and Ph.D. programs.

Clinical simulation opportunities in the simulation center are integrated across all B.S.N., Direct Entry M.S.N. and advanced practice nursing specialty programs.

The Direct Entry M.S.N. program for individuals with non-nursing baccalaureate degrees consists of five semesters and 75 credits.

Students complete **clinical rotations in 75 hospitals**, long-term and memory care facilities, clinics and community health settings.

133+ students have graduated since 2007 in the **Project Beyond/Project Beyond-2** program, a government-funded award to increase B.S.N. student diversity.

Marquette's Veteran Affairs Nursing Academic Partnership (VANAP) program was one of the first six established in 2012. Scholars in the program complete their clinicals at the VA hospital, requiring less training and onboarding after their hire into veterans health care.

Clinical hours are required for B.S.N. and Direct Entry M.S.N. students.
