

PHIL 4955H – HONORS SUPPLEMENT (1 CR.)

INFORMATION AND APPLICATION

What is an “Honors Supplement”?

PHIL 4955H – Honors Supplement is a one-credit add-on course option that allows students enrolled in Core and/or Philosophy Disciplinary Honors to undertake self-designed supplementary research, creative, or service projects in conjunction with three-credit 3000- or 4000-level Philosophy courses. Upon successful completion of the PHIL 4955H project as well as the associated course, students earn an Honors credit on top of three regular course credits. Students can propose independent projects or group projects (normally for small groups of up to three students). An appropriate project will normally require an additional three hours of work per week.

Sample projects appropriate for an independent PHIL 4955H project:

- The completion of an annotated bibliography, literature review, and/or thesis proposal, in preparation for writing a senior thesis.
- Reading a book related to the course and completing a book review, either for an academic journal or the general public.
- Identifying a related current issue and preparing and submitting a philosophically informed op-ed on the topic.
- Completing an artistic or creative project that relates to and explores related themes.

Sample projects appropriate for a group PHIL 4955H project:

- Organizing and participating in a reading group that explores select topics in greater depth throughout the semester and culminates in a presentation for the class.
- Preparing a Wikipedia page for an important missing entry.
- Identifying and executing an on-campus service project that raises awareness of a related issue and/or intervenes on an existing issue.

Who can take the “Honors Supplement”?

PHIL 4955H can only be taken in conjunction with a 3000- or 4000-level Philosophy course and must be taken for a grade. It requires the consent of the course instructor and the Director of the Philosophy Disciplinary Honors Program. Enrollment is restricted to students enrolled in Core and/or Disciplinary Honors. Students can take PHIL 4955H twice.

How do I get started?

Start drawing up a proposal! And reach out to the course instructor earlier rather than later to make sure the instructor is able and willing to work with you on the kind of project you’re interested in pursuing. A complete proposal will include:

- (i) a description of a specific project that clearly relates to but demonstrably exceeds coursework;
- (ii) specific deadline(s) for the completion of the project and a specific schedule for regular (not necessarily frequent) check-ins with the instructor; and
- (iii) a copy of the current course syllabus.

Students applying to complete a group project must each submit an application. Proposals, with student signature, signature of course instructor, and signature of the Director of Disciplinary Honors, must be submitted by the add/drop deadline.
